What We Believe



Care, Guidance and Support

The quality of care, guidance and support received by Wyedean students is one of the great strengths of the school. We know that the teenage years can be a turbulent time, and our staff are prepared to guide and support students of all ages as they move through the school. Relationships at Wyedean are based on mutual respect, and our students know that there is always someone to turn to if they need anything. Our pastoral system has been praised by successive Ofsted inspections and by successive generations of parents and students; one of our students commented to an Ofsted inspector, "It's just like a giant family".

Form tutors, pastoral support assistants, schools counsellors are all on hand to ensure that Wyedean students thrive and are able to meet successfully the challenges of secondary school life. Wyedean may seem daunting to a primary school boy or girl; they will rapidly feel part of the Wyedean family after about two weeks thanks to our outstanding pastoral care.

Extra-Curricular Activities

There is much more to life at Wyedean than five lessons a day. There are many opportunities for students to get involved in all kinds of activities which enrich and extend our normal curriculum.

Wyedean has a long sporting tradition. We field successful teams in all the major sports – athletics, basketball, cricket, cross-country, football, hockey, netball and rugby. While we are always proud of individual and team achievements, we also have a genuine "Sport for All" philosophy at Wyedean, where participation, enjoyment and health-related fitness are the keys to our programme.

We have always been known for the quality of our music and drama at Wyedean. Our musical tradition extends from soloists, specialist groups and ensembles, through large choirs and orchestras to major music tours to European cities. Dramatic productions range from large-scale performances to smaller ensemble pieces. The emphasis in extra-curricular Music and Drama is on a mixture of excellence and involvement from as many students as possible.

Our students also have the opportunity to take part in a wide variety of trips and visits, organised to enrich their school experience. These include visits to the battlefields of the First World War; football, rugby and netball tours; skiing trips; and visits organised to support the curriculum.





If You Want To Join Us

We welcome applications to Wyedean from students throughout Gloucestershire and Monmouthshire.

The application process to Wyedean School for boys and girls in Year 6 is run for us by Gloucestershire County Council. They organise the 174 places that we have for students in Year 7 each year.

Parents of Year 6 students will receive an application form in the Autumn Term. If you live in Gloucestershire, this should be returned to Shire Hall, Gloucester. If you live in Monmouthshire, it should be returned to County Hall, Cwmbran; they will send any requests for places at Wyedean to Gloucester.
